A sudden loss of independence challenges the body and spirit. For more than 25 years, the Cone Health Inpatient Rehabilitation Center has helped patients and families return to full, productive lives after experiencing the effects of a debilitating illness or injury.

The Inpatient Rehabilitation Center, located at The Moses H. Cone Memorial Hospital, provides specialized rehabilitation services as well as access to sophisticated critical care. The Center is staffed by an experienced and dedicated team of physicians and rehabilitation professionals who provide personalized, comprehensive and fully integrated care.

Cone Health maintains accreditation from The Joint Commission. The Inpatient Rehabilitation Center is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation for Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF) for comprehensive inpatient rehabilitation and for specialty programs in stroke and brain injury rehabilitation. The Inpatient Rehabilitation Center is part of a continuum of care that includes a network of outpatient rehabilitation centers and a variety of community support groups.



Comprehensive Inpatient Rehabilitation Services

Cone Health Inpatient Rehabilitation Center provides comprehensive rehabilitation services to individuals who have experienced a serious injury or illness.

Patients needing comprehensive rehabilitation can include individuals who have undergone back surgery, hip or knee replacement surgery, those who have experienced bone fractures or individuals who have experienced limb loss. Patients who have become severely weakened by heart or lung disease, surgery, cancer or degenerative neuromuscular disorders such as multiple sclerosis or Guillain-Barré syndrome also can benefit from comprehensive rehabilitation. The rehabilitation physician and team members work with patients and families to create treatment plans to help patients regain as much independence as possible, with the goal of returning to their homes and communities. Based on individual needs, patients receive rehabilitation nursing and therapy services, counseling services, case management to plan for discharge and follow-up services and ongoing education regarding their illness or injury, recovery and health promotion.

The patient, family members and caregivers are the center of the rehabilitation treatment team and guide program treatment planning. Families and caregivers are encouraged to participate in all aspects of the rehabilitation program, including therapy sessions and education classes. The Center's "apartment" gives patients and families an opportunity to practice skills in a homelike setting. Community outings provide a chance to practice skills outside the hospital. Family conferences are scheduled as needed or upon request.

Admission Criteria

To be admitted to the Cone Health Inpatient Rehabilitation Center, patients must meet the following criteria:

- Need close medical supervision by a physician with a specialty in rehabilitation.
- Be medically able to participate in rehabilitation activities.
- Require intensive rehabilitation services for problems in two or more of the following areas: self-care, mobility, cognition/communication.
- Need 24-hour rehabilitation nursing care, and require at least two of the following: physical therapy, occupational therapy, speech therapy.
- Have the potential to participate in at least three hours of therapy per day, five days a week.
- Be likely to benefit significantly from the program within a reasonable period of time.
- Have an identified preliminary discharge plan.
- Be 18 years of age or older.
- Be free from any major psychiatric or behavior disorder.



Our General Rehabilitation Program offers a full range of specialized services including:

- Management by board-certified physicians who specialize in physical medicine and rehabilitation (physiatrists).
- Rehabilitation nursing.
- Physical, occupational and speech therapy services with a minimum of three hours of therapy per day, five days a week and modified therapy programming during the remainder of the week.
- Access to local support groups for patients and families.
- Assistive technology assessment.
- Cognitive rehabilitation.
- Community outings for practice in a “real world” setting.
- Discharge planning to help with the transition to home or to the next level of care.
- Home evaluations, when indicated, to check for problems or architectural barriers in the home environment.
- Neuropsychological services.
- Nurse case management for coordination of care.
- Nutrition management.
- Pastoral care services.
- Patient and family education.
- Pet therapy.
- Social work services.
- Therapeutic recreation services.

Discharge from the Program

The rehabilitation team works with patients and families to ensure a smooth transition at discharge. Discharge from the program is a planned event that occurs when patients achieve their rehabilitation goals. Discharge also may occur if a patient becomes too ill to participate in the program, is unable to progress toward goals or declines to participate in the program.
